Judah Joslyn is a Black, Transmasculine, Queer person born in San Diego and raised in Sacramento. Judah graduated with a Bachelor's in Psychology and a Minor in Education from the University of California, Davis. After graduating from university, Judah was accepted into Oregon State University Master's in Clinical Mental Health Counseling with the intention of providing targeted mental health services to BIPOC Trans and Queer communities in the future. Judah is currently Trans & Queer Youth Collective (TQYC) as the Executive Director.

Judah is also an activist within Sacramento through a grassroots collective, Sacramento Street EMS. During the George Floyd Protest, Judah formed Sacramento Street EMS to provide aid to protestors, mutual aid services and to work with other community organizations throughout Sacramento to uplift Black and Brown communities with the direct intent of building strong, resilient communities. Judah continues to work with numerous BIPOC led groups on several projects to center those voices and create resources and opportunities for BIPOC folks to be empowered. From centering mutual aid programs for Black, Brown, and unhoused folks to creating restorative BIPOC centered healing spaces, Judah is dedicated to creating transformative and trauma-informed spaces that address the needs of the most marginalized communities by centering them in frameworks of social and restorative justice.
